Space is limited, and participation will be on a first-come, first-served basis. Once a camp is full, students may be added to a waiting list. Waiting lists do not count as an extra registration, and students on a waiting list CAN register for an alternative camp session. In the event of an opening in the camp where the student is on the wait list, parents will be notified and given the opportunity to change their child's registration.
