Members of the Matador Band who competed in the fall semester in the Texas Music Educators Association All-State Band process continued to compete and perform in January

and February. Twenty Matador Band students performed in the TMEA All-Region Band Concert at Smithson Valley High School on Jan. 19. Seven of these students also earned positions in the All-Region Orchestra, and performed a concert on Dec. 1 at Reagan HS. Ten students advanced to compete at the All-Area Band level on Jan. 12 at the University of Texas at Austin. The band is very proud of Ethan Bowles, Brennen Turner, and Mickey Zukerman, who earned positions in the TMEA All-State Band. These students represented Seguin High School and the Seguin community as members of the All-State 5A Symphonic Band at the TMEA annual conference, including performing a concert on Feb. 16 at the Lila Cockrell Theatre in San Antonio.

Approximately 210 students participated at the event, which was hosted by the Seguin MLK Committee. The finale was a performance of "Oye" by Jim Papoulis of the combined groups. 

Kiss Me Kate Musical a success for HS fine arts department



The SHS Theatre Arts Department performed "Kiss Me Kate", a musical by Cole Porter, for audiences on Jan. 25-27. The cast consisted of 35 HS theatre students, and was supported by 12 choir students in an off-stage chorus, a pit wind orchestra of 25 band students, and a production crew of 10 technical theatre students. The Seguin High School PAC provides the necessary venue for a state of the art production, including full backdrops, elaborate scenery, wireless micro-

phone sound amplification, and professional lighting. The performances were spectacular and met with rave revues from audience members after each performance.

One-Act Play productions earn recognition

The Seguin HS theatre company produced "Chemical Imbalance: A Jekyll and Hyde Play", by Lauren Wilson, for UIL One-Act play competition. The production featured eleven cast members, two alternates, and a crew of five students. The students presented a public performance on March 5 at the Seguin High School PAC. The Seguin High School theatre department then hosted the first series of UIL One Act Play contests. Region 26 5A Zone and District

contests ran for 3 days with Seguin High School theatre students serving as technical crew, hospitality and host crew, as well as competing themselves! The students competed with 4 other schools in the Zone competition. The play ranked first and advanced to District competition on March 20. Students earning awards included Best Actor - Jonah Reilly; All Star Cast - Serenity De Leon, Megan Schievelbein, and Faith Sehon; Honorable Mention - Harris Franz and Ellie Follis; and All Star Technician - Baileigh Aldridge. The performance at the District level earned the production a third place finish, as alternate to the next round. Individual awards included Honorable Mention All Star Cast for Jonah Reilly and All-Star Technician Abigail Lopez.



Seguin ISD middle schools theatre students also compete in One Act play competition. The contests mirror the high school UIL One-Act Play contest, and students are judged on acting and technical elements of a show that is between 18 and 40 minutes in length. The show is run solely by the students on the day of the contest. The first middle school contest was held at



Judson High School on Jan 9-10. Briesemeister theatre students produced the show "LaFayette No. 1" by Mandy Conner. The show earned First Place Play and Best Overall Tech. Students earned awards, including All Star Technician - Oddie Barron; Best Actor -Garrett Reinhard; All Star Cast - Alliyah Watson and Aaniyiah Maxwell; Honorable Mention All Star Cast - Julian Bermea and Tea DeLeon. 
