As you know, on Nov. 8 the Seguin community approved Bond 2022 to provide \$131 million toward muchneeded new facilities, improvements and infrastructure. This represents the to Joshua Bright for his successful largest bond initiative in the history of our district, and its benefits will impact thousands of students for many years to come.

I want to thank our administrative team, our campus administrators, and our board of trustees for their community engagement efforts. In the span of two months, 38 community presentations were held to share details about proposed projects, tax implications and voting information. I appreciate the community and civic organizations that hosted these informational bond presentations to learn more about what was proposed on the ballot.

Bond 2022 would not have been possible without the support of our Seguin ISD families and those who voted in favor of the bond initiative. While the programs outlined in Proposition B will have to be put on hold for another day, 6,991 Seguin ISD stakeholders voted in favor of the \$131 million approved in Proposition Α.

This was a vote for the future of our students, the future of our staff, and the future of education in Seguin ISD. Thank you for entrusting us to oversee these improvements for our school community.

Election Day also brought in a new trustee to District 7. Congratulations campaign to serve on the board. I look forward to working with Mr. Bright on the Team of Eight as we collaborate to meet the needs of all students.

I also want to take this opportunity to personally thank Glenda Moreno for serving as the District 7 trustee since 2018. Seguin ISD is a better place thanks to her leadership and guidance. It is my hope that she will continue to remain active in our schools, especially in the Seguin Sports Booster Club.
