Minutes, May 20th, 2020

- Welcome and Introductions
 - Trason Willemin called the meeting to order 5:35.
 - Trason welcomed all to the online Zoom meeting. In attendance were Trason and Allison Willemin, Lisa Burns, Jacob Galvan, Michele Meehan, Carmen Davila, Mark Dibble, Bethany Polk and Pete Silvius.
- Update on on-going projects-
 - Meeting Minutes were approved for the January 8th 2020 meeting (Motion by Mark Dibble and a 2nd by Michele Meehan)
 - Jacob Galvan explained that he required TDA Triennial Assessment has been delayed one year due to Covid 19. Jacob and his Child Nutrition team will continue the work to assess our Wellness Plan as part of the TDA Triennial Assessment so we are ready when the requirement date is announced.
 - Pete provided an update on the playground project. Work is underway at all campuses. McQueeney, Patlan and Rodriguez are complete and Jefferson is close to completion. Vogel, Koennecke and Weinert all have the sidewalk and flatwork completed. All schools are scheduled to be complete mid-August.
- Discussion on new projects-
 - Kirsten shared the recently developed Seguin ISD Covid-19 Preparedness and Response Plan. This plan outlines procedures and policies that SISD has put in place to support a safe environment for staff, students and the community. Bethany Polk (School Transformation Grant Director) shared about the recent grant award to Seguin ISD. The grant will support increased mental health support, restorative practices training, positive behavior supports and school safety initiatives.
 - Pete share a recent partnership with Hazel Health. Hazel Health is a telemedicine connection for campus nurses to reach Texas Licensed Physicians through a digital kiosk. This service is free to the district. Parents can opt into the service that could provide a virtual doctors visit through the campus nurse. Services to families will be free if students are on Medicaid or are uninsured. Private Insurance families would have a copay to use the service. The district will provide additional details about the program as we rollout the service. The SHAC membership expressed a concern to be sure the keep our local Physicians aware and engaged with this rollout.
